JOE'S STORY

Joe was 39 years old. He had just earned his MBA. He was healthy. He stayed physically active daily, working out at his local gym. He did not know that his heart did not match his external physique.

He had just finished a workout. Nothing was different than any other day he spent at the gym. He felt great, having just exercised. He was walking through the lobby and getting ready to drive home when his heart stopped beating.

He dropped to the ground. No one at the gym did anything to help as they had no AED on site. Even if one was available, it is likely that no one would have known what to do. And while 9-1-1 was called, they arrived too late to resuscitate Joe.

Joe is survived by his parents, Steve and Linda Hursh, long-term supporters of S.C.A.R.F. He is survived by his daughter, Molly, a talented artist who created the Rhythm of Life gala logo for S.C.A.R.F. several years ago.

S.C.A.R.F. would like to thank the Hursh family for their support over the years. We wish Joe was here as well, but we are doing everything we can to get more AEDs into the community so that no other family has to lose a loved one in a similar fashion.

550,000+ CARDIAC ARRESTS

Over 550,000 cardiac arrests/deaths occur across the United States annually, making it the #1 cause of death in this country.

3-10% SURVIVAL RATE

Chances of survival from cardiac arrest are reported anywhere from 3 - 10%. But when an AED is applied prior to EMS arrival, survival rates can triple!
